Since the inception of the QRT as a collaborative community response model in 2013, the "build" and how a QRT serves have evolved. The original model was created as a "first emergency first" public safety-led model, with law enforcement, fire, and EMS partnering with social work professionals to serve at-risk and vulnerable community members. Over time, the model has evolved to serve individuals and communities through various community partnerships, and a flexibility that is most appropriate for each locality. Predictive Modeling and QRT Applications

In 2020, the West Virginia Office of Drug Control Policy (ODCP) discovered and identified eight counties that carried 60% of the overdose burden in the state and labeled them Action Counties. In 2021, the ODCP Regional Coordinators were on boarded to specifically target these Action Counties within their region of focus. In 2022, as a result of these initiatives, the regression analysis model for preventing an overdose was developed in the Eastern Panhandle of WV by two ODCP Regional Coordinators and is now being replicated in all eight action counties. This model allows a window of time prior to a ...
